A 40-hour course of instruction in Forensic Digital Photography

This course is designed to teach basic and advanced photographic techniques that are required to document crime scenes and accident scenes for court presentation. Topics will include the following:

- Functions and controls of digital single-lens-reflex (DSLR) cameras
- Managing depth of field and motion control
- Close-up photography
- Functions and controls of detachable flash units
- Solving lighting problems using fill-flash, painting with light, menu selections
- Interior and exterior crime scene and accident scene documentation
- Photographing victims and suspects
- Systematic approaches for managing digital images
- Introduction to Microsoft PowerPoint
