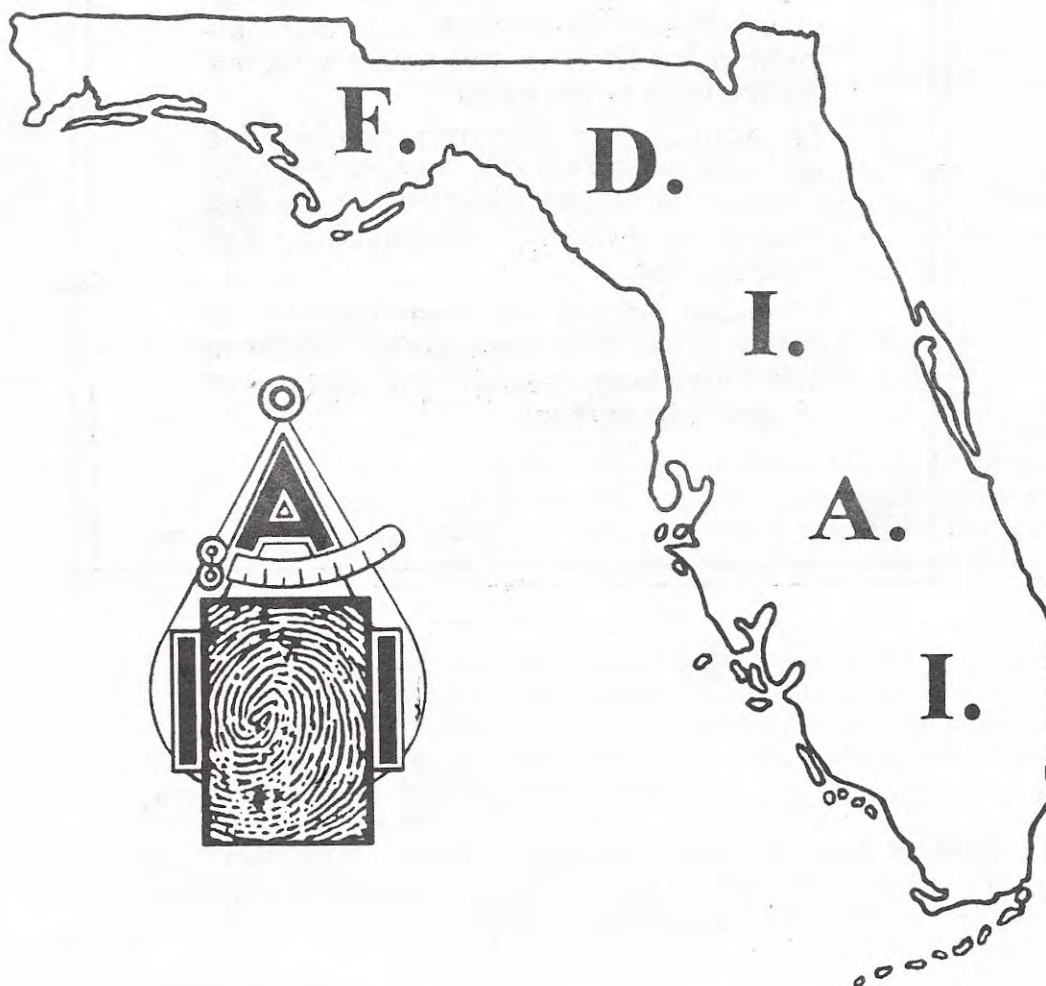

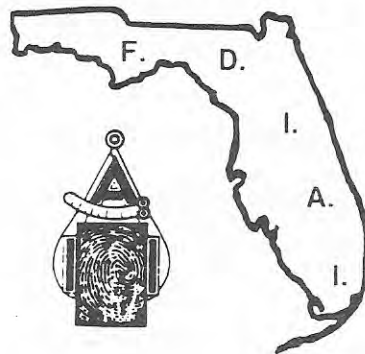
To cooperate with other men of the Profession, promote improvement through research, and disseminate such advancement in my effort to make more effective the analysis of the expert.




